A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners.

I am excited to share the 2023-24 Annual Report with you! As I reflect on the past year, I am reminded of the words of the Apostle Paul: "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ." OLA has truly come OLA School, under the leadership of Mrs. Mandy Crock, together as one in the body in Christ to further His mission, and I feel that we have finally left behind the shadow of Covid and that we are becoming a better OLA.

Last October 2023, we paid off the Parish debt for the Church, Rectory, Moylan Hall, and Preschool. Six months ago, we upgraded our Columbarium with wrought iron gates and added the statues of Our Lady along with two Angels. We also repaired bricks and crumbling walls at the entrance, giving the Columbarium not only a new look Our finances are in good shape, but like you, we are but, more importantly, a more prayerful setting.

I am also happy to report – or more excited about – our new pipe organ and risers that will be installed, I hope, by Christmas! Parts have been delayed so I ask for your prayers. "It's in God's hands."

Our attendance at Mass (in all three languages) has returned to pre-COVID levels—thanks be to God – and you! We've added 113 new households including strong growth in our Latino community. I would like to thank Fr. Robert Perez, Enrique Lopez, and Deacon Ed Patterson for leading this community. Additionally, the Indonesian community is growing with the guidance of our new permanent priest, Peter Pitol, with assistance from Robert Susanto, along with Deacon Antonius Anugerah. They are looking forward to celebrating their 25th anniversary at OLA next spring.

Our Preschool, under the new leadership of Kathleen Jackowski, is thriving with 94 students from 71 families. Mrs. Jackowski is grateful for the new sidewalk installed near the playground this summer, providing a safer environment for our little ones.

has an enrollment of 585 students from 381 families. We are proud to be the largest elementary school in the Archdiocese, which is a testament to the excellent education provided by our faculty and administration.

I encourage you to continue supporting our ministries in Worship, Education, and Service by attending church, joining a ministry, and participating in our Faith Formation and Adult Education programs.




