VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS/ SAFE ENVIRONMENT

The mission of the Safe Environment Office of the Archdiocese of Atlanta is to insure that children, young people, and vulnerable individuals who worship, study, or participate in activities sponsored therein can do so in the safest and most secure setting possible. All volunteers who work with vulnerable individuals MUST complete Safe Environment Training and be cleared by the Archdiocese PRIOR to any volunteer activity by completing all the following steps:

- Read all Safe Environment Policies,
- Attend a live VIRTUS Protecting God's Children Training, and
- Complete and Submit the required paperwork to Benny Strozier (bstrozier@olachurch.org) in the parish office:
 - a) Volunteer Application,
 - b) Sterling Background Consent Form, and
 - c) Safe Environment Acknowledgement Standards of Conduct.

All of these steps must be completed before you can volunteer with are children, youth, or other vulerable persons.

ACTIVE PARISHIONER STATUS FOR CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

The Archdiocese of Atlanta requires all families to submit a Parish Verification form to their Catholic School to verify that the family is registered and active in the parish.

The Archdiocese defines "active parishioners" as those registered and worshipping members who contribute of their time, talent and financial resources to support the Parish by the following:

- Regular attendance at liturgy,
- · Consistent financial support of the parish, and
- Volunteer involvement within the parish.

Volunteer involvement within the parish **does not include attendance at events**, but requires active membership and frequent participation in one or more of our many ministries. Also, active status in the parish **does not include volunteering in the school or other non-parish service**.

While we encourage children to be active in ministry to the parish, status is dependent on the involvement of the parents.

Financial Support and Volunteer Involvement is **only considered for the CURRENT SCHOOL CALENDAR YEAR**, not previous years.

Families must adhere to the requirements above to receive "active parishioner" status.
